



Call Before You Dig, Know What's Below

There could be many things below ground in your yard besides earth worms. It's also where utility lines are located, including the infrastructure for electricity, water, sewer, gas/ petroleum, and communications.

Before you begin any construction project (even small jobs like planting trees and shrubs), call 811 to get utility lines located and marked for free. Keep in mind that the depth of utility lines varies and there may be multiple utility lines in a common area. Digging without calling can disrupt service to an entire neighborhood, harm you and those around you, or even potentially result in fines and repair costs.

With one quick call to 811, all utilities in your area will be notified to come and mark the location of their lines. When you call, be prepared to pinpoint the location of your dig site, describe the type of work to be done, and provide your planned start date for the project. **Remember to call at least two business days before you dig.**



Large Print Bills Now Available

Lightning Season - Stay Safe During Spring Storms

Spring is here, and with it will undoubtedly come another wave of thunderstorms. Remember — a lightning bolt can carry billions of watts of electricity. If a strike occurs near your home, it can send a powerful surge that could damage your electronics and potentially injure you.

To help stay safe and protect your electronic investments, be sure to unplug your computers, televisions, modems, fax machines, VCRs, cable outlets, and telephones before bad weather hits, so you're not in contact with these items during the storm. In addition, avoid contact with metallic items and plumbing, including faucets and bathtubs, until the storm is over.

Of course, a storm can strike any time, and you may not be home to prepare adequately. With that in mind, it's a good idea to have a surge protector with a built-in phone line. It won't provide 100% protection, but it will help. And while you're at it, you may want to ask your insurance provider what's covered under your homeowner's policy in the event of storm damage.

Best Carrot Cake

Yield: 1 (9-inch) 3-layer cake

| 2 cups all-purpose flour | 2 teaspoons vanilla extract |
| 2 teaspoons baking soda | 2 cups grated carrot |
| 1/2 teaspoon salt | 1 (8-ounce) can crushed
pineapple, drained |
| 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon | 1 (3 1/2-ounce) can flaked
coconut |
| 3 large eggs | 1 cup chopped pecans or
walnuts |
| 2 cups sugar | |
| 3/4 cup vegetable oil | |
| 3/4 cup buttermilk | |

Directions: Line 3 (9-inch) round cake pans with wax paper; lightly grease and flour wax paper. Set pans aside. Stir together first 4 ingredients. Beat eggs and next 4 ingredients at medium speed with an electric mixer until smooth. Add flour mixture, beating at low speed until blended. Fold in carrot and next 3 ingredients. Pour batter into prepared cake pans. Bake at 350° for 25 to 30 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Drizzle Buttermilk Glaze evenly over layers; cool in pans on wire racks 15 minutes.

Buttermilk Glaze Ingredients:

| 1 cup sugar | 1 tablespoon light
corn syrup |
| 1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda | 1 teaspoon vanilla extract |
| 1/2 cup buttermilk | |
| 1/2 cup butter or margarine | |

Preparation: Bring first 5 ingredients to a boil in a large Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Boil, stirring often, 4 minutes. Remove from heat, and stir in vanilla. Remove from pans, and cool completely on wire racks.

Cream Cheese Frosting Ingredients:

- 3/4 cup butter or margarine, softened
- 1 (8-ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 1 (3-ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 3 cups sifted powdered sugar
- 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Preparation: Beat butter and cream cheese at medium speed with an electric mixer until creamy. Add powdered sugar and vanilla; beat until smooth. Spread Cream Cheese Frosting between layers and on top and sides of cake.
